MINUTES OF REGULAR LOGAN EAST RURAL WATER SYSTEM ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

The regular meeting of the Logan East Rural Water System Advisory Committee was called to order by Ron Dierking-Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Monday July 17, 2023 at 8:00 p.m. in the Logan East Rural Water System Office Oakland, Nebraska. The Publication of Meeting Notice was printed in the Oakland Independent newspaper on July 6, 2023.

The Nebraska Open Meeting Act information is posted by the entrance door.

Roll call was taken with 7 of the 9 committee members present. Present: Dam, Dierking, Fehrer Johnson, Lydick, Scheer, and Wulf. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger. Roll call of Lower Elkhorn NRD appointed members. Present: Gary Loftis Absent: Roger Gustafson. Brian Bruckner, LENRD Interim Manager was also in attendance.

Scheer made the motion & was seconded by Dam to <u>adopt the agenda</u>. Aye: All. Nay: none. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Minutes of the June 12, 2023 meeting were read. Fehrer made the motion and was seconded by Scheer to approve the minutes. Aye: All. Nay: none. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger. MOTION CARRIED

Income & expense reports were given. 19 customers still owe for May water. All disconnection letters have paid.

Dam made the motion and was seconded by Wulf to ratify a new service for Patricia Cronin & RJ Kline Twp:20 Twp:10 Sec:18 Burt county, for the \$3,500. hook up fee. Aye: Dam, Dierking, Fehrer, Johnson, Lydick, Scheer, and Wulf. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger MOTION CARRIED

Johnson made the motion and was seconded by Scheer to ratify a new service for Calab Grefe 9190 CR 9 Arlington Twp: 18 Rg:9 Sec 24 Washington Co. Aye: Dam, Dierking, Fehrer, Johnson, Lydick, Scheer, and Wulf. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger. MOTION CARRIED

Next was Agenda item #7 discussion about the generator yearly service agreement which was tabled last month. Blahak reported well #1 generator has been used 55 hours since installed. Options quoted by Mason with Nebraska Generator were presented. Dam made the motion and was seconded by Wulf to sign a contract with Nebraska Generator for 2-year service plan including both generators for a total of \$1,500. The 1st year/inspection only for \$500.00 and 2nd year/inspection with service & oil change at \$1,000. Aye: Dam, Dierking, Fehrer, Johnson, Lydick, Scheer, and Wulf. Absent: Hagerbaumer & Kruger. **MOTION CARRIED**

New well search: A test well on the Roy Miller ground Twp:22 Rg:07 Sec:25 was drilled by Sargent Drilling on June 21, 2023. Sue Lackey-NU geologist sent an explanation of the formations on a graph (attached to these minutes). Over-all the site looks promising for quantity, pumping 317 gallons per minute in a 6" casing with a drawdown of 40 gallons per foot. Gallons would increase with a larger casing on a permanent well. No water quality test results have been received yet.

Dam asked about how this project will affect the current customer's rates. Dierking reminded the committee that Bartlett & West's recommendation that more well capacity is needed for the current system use. The

LERWS committee discussed the opportunity to increase the well field by including the Village of Craig to the service area. Lydick asked about the percentage of the total project costs that government grants could

possibly cover. Brian Bruckner, LENRD will contact the State concerning the funding & make sure all requirements are being met to meet the needs for the Village of Craig.

Blahak gave the managers' report (see attached copy).

The next meeting will be August 14, 2023 at the LERWS office in Oakland at 7:30 p.m.

Being no further business Dierking adjourned the meeting at 9:10 p.m..
